STARSkate

Skills, Tests, Achievement, Recognition – this is what STARSkate is all about!

STARSkate offers opportunities for skaters of all ages to develop fundamental figure skating skills in the areas of ice dance, skating skills, free skate and interpretive skating. Unique in Canada, this program teaches figure skating skills in a group and/or private lesson format in a progressive and sequential manner and includes specifically designed awards and incentives. Skaters have the opportunity to take Skate Canada Tests through a nationally standardized testing system. Skaters who have mastered figure skating skills in STARSkate may also choose to pursue synchronized skating or pairs skating.

The STARSkate competition program is comprised of 10 different STAR levels for skaters who have completed the CanSkate program. It introduces participants to key components of figure skating including performance, assessment, and competition. STAR 1-5 fits into the Learn Train level of Skate Canada's Long-Term Athlete Development Model (LTADM).



Each stage of this national program emphasizes key skills

as turns, stroking, jumps, spins, and different aspects of performance that have been designated by figure skating experts as necessary for development and progression in our sport. It is important to note that every skater is unique and will advance at different rates due to various factors such as growth spurts and participation. To accommodate individual needs, the STAR 1-5 competition program is designed to be fluid and allow skaters to progress at their own pace, even skipping levels if appropriate; skaters may move through several levels in a season or stay at the same level – it's all dependent on individual athlete development! At all stages and levels, parents should discuss their skater's progress with their coach to determine the best options for them.

The STARSkate legacy

STARSkate has been the mainstay of figure skating in Canada for more than four decades.

When you/your child registers for a STARSkate program at your local Skate Canada club, you also become a member of Skate Canada and will have access to:

- opportunities to be recognized through a nationally standardized testing system for achieving specific figure skating skills
- complimentary Gold Test pins
- invitational and interclub competitions, including the STARSkate championship stream

- specifically designed awards and incentives such as badges, tattoos and stickers
- STARSkate Skater of the Year awards program
- Progress updates and report cards
- Special STARSkate events and club functions
- Opportunity to be talent-scouted
- Opportunity for personal growth and the development of important life skills such as goal-setting, selfdiscipline, confidence, time management, healthy lifestyle and coping strategies to deal with success and failure.

These are some of the awards and incentives that have been developed to encourage athletes in the STARSkate Program.

How STARSkate works

The STARSkate program consists of figure skating skills in four areas — Skating Skills, Ice Dance, Free Skate and Interpretive. Each area is divided into the following levels:

• Skating Skills: Preliminary, Junior Bronze

• Free Skating: Preliminary, Junior Bronze

Dance: Preliminary, Junior Bronze

Interpretive: Introductory

Dance: Senior Bronze, Junior Silver

• Interpretive: Bronze

Senior Level Tests

Skating Skills: Senior Silver, Gold

Free Skating: Senior Silver, Gold

Dance: Senior Silver, Gold, Diamond

Interpretive: Silver, Gold

What Options do I have as a STARSkate Athlete?

Once a skater is in the Skate Canada STARSkate Program, there are several of options. Skaters may choose to remain in the STARSkate Program, taking tests (although not mandatory) at organized test sessions and honing learned skills. Skaters may also choose to enter competitions, while still trying Skate Canada tests. Other skaters may feel that they have progressed to a point where they may wish to enter the Skate Canada CompetitiveSkate Program or become involved in synchronized skating, evaluating or judging, or participate as an adult or varsity member.

Skating Skills

Skating Skills are a combination of fundamental skating movements, executed on a pattern and skated solo. The basic components of all disciplines of figure skating are incorporated into the program. The movements are derived from former compulsory figures, free skating and ice dancing. The objective of the Skating Skills program is mastery of the basic fundamentals of skating – edge quality, control, power and speed.

There are 6 Skating Skills tests in the STARSkate program:

Preliminary

- Junior Bronze
- Senior Bronze
- Junior Silver
- Senior Silver
- Gold

Ice Dance

Consisting of seven levels of tests, the Dance Test program teaches timing, musicality, rhythm interpretation, structure as well as basic skating skills such as edges, flow, control and unison.

The dances in the STARSkate Program can be tried in any order but a candidate must pass the required number of dances in a dance test before proceeding to the next level. In addition to the traditional compulsory dances, there are also Creative Dances to challenge skaters' creativity, artistry and originality.

The Dance Tests are as follows:

- Preliminary
- Junior Bronze
- Senior Bronze
- Junior Silver
- Senior Silver
- Gold
- Diamond

Free Skate

Free skating consists of the execution of jumps, spins, footwork, field movements and stroking, either in isolation or performed in sequence to music.

There are six Free Skating tests in the STARSkate Program:

- Preliminary
- Junior Bronze
- Senior Bronze
- Junior Silver
- Senior Silver
- Gold

Each test consists of 2 parts – Elements in Isolation and a Free Program.

Interpretive

The objective of the Interpretive program is to encourage and develop skaters' creativity, expression, musicality, movement, interpretation of music, as well as the use of space, rhythm, line and style. The program provides skaters with the opportunity to explore the performance aspect of skating without focusing on technical elements.

The Interpretive tests consist of skating to and interpreting a piece of music 2.0 to 3.0 minutes (+/- 10 seconds) in length. Skaters can take Interpretive tests as individuals and/or as a couple (male/female, female/female or male/male) at four levels:

- Introductory
- Bronze
- Silver
- Gold

Competitions for STARSkate Athletes

STARSkate participants love to compete! Our feedback indicates that even though a skater may choose not to participate in the Skate Canada CompetitiveSkate Program, they still want the opportunity to test their skill in a competition situation. Skate Canada offers several opportunities to do this.

Club Competitions

Clubs offer competitions for their own members to compete against each other. The club determines the categories which generally follow Skate Canada STARSkate guidelines (e.g. length of program, category name, type of event offered, etc.) The club may also offer other creative events such as longest shoot-the-duck, similar pairs, spins and jumps, etc.)

STARSkate Interclub Competitions

These are events involving a number of clubs in the same region or area. The competition categories offered generally fall in line with the applicable Skate Canada Section specifications, so that all Interclubs within the Section are standardized (this allows Skate Canada Sections to offer a Section Final). The STARSkate Championship program provides opportunities for skaters who want to remain in the STARSkate program but also want to have the challenge of competing up to a Sectional level in a credible, nationally standardized event.

Invitational Competitions

These are events coordinated by a Section or Club(s) and offered, generally, to STARSkaters and competitive skaters. Most events fall within Skate Canada's specifications regarding program length and eligibility to compete. For more information contact the hosting Section or club.

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: SKATER COMMITMENT

Skate Canada's new StarSkate program has been strategically designed to fit with the Long Term Athlete Development Plan. This plan, which was created by Skate Canada to be in line with Sport Canada's requirements, guides all levels of skaters up and through to their end goal - be that competitive skating, recreation while they are young or active for life. Recognizing the value in both the new StarSkate program and the LTAD will help our skaters reach their goals this coming season and in the future. The LTAD specifies minimum ice requirements, set by level, that are recommended/needed for skaters to experience regular growth and improvement on the ice. These are the MINIMUM recommendations for a RECREATIONAL StarSkater. Star level listed refers to Star FreeSkate Competition level.

Star 1	2-3 days (Junior)
Star 2	3 days (Junior)
Star 3	3-4 days (Senior)
Star 4	4 days (Senior)
Star 5	4-5 days (Senior)

As our regular StarSkate ice times for this year reflect only 2 days/week, many of our skaters will not be receiving the required ice time they need. STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: WHAT IS INCLUDED IN FEES?

Skate Canada, advertising, bank charges, merchant fees, signage, awards, website, ice and room rental, head coach administration and off-ice fees, supplementary instructor fees (nutritionist, dance instructor, etc), printing, gifts, supplies, event and party decorations, food, costumes, props, etc..

A portion of the STARSkate fees also covers on-ice coach time (60 minutes per week for JR's, 30 minutes per week for SR's)

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: OFF-ICE & SUPPLEMENTARY CLASSES

In the Learn to Train Stage, skaters should participate in a variety of other sports and activities to become better athletes and more well-rounded skaters in both body and mind. As in the Learn to Skate stage, the specific types of activities will depend on the specific socio-cultural context of the athlete but coaches, parents, and clubs are encouraged to explore the different opportunities that exist in their communities.

That said, at this stage of development more sport-specific activities such as off-ice technical jumping classes should be introduced to help with body development and awareness and the understanding of movement patterns. It is important to note that the proportion of on-ice to off-ice activity is also seasonal and subject to periodization. Knowledge of the intentions behind warm-up, cool-down, stretching, nutrition, hydration, and rest and recovery should be encouraged. At point of entry into Learn to Train, skaters should be participating in one to two hours of sport-specific off-ice activity each week, for 20 to 40 weeks of the year.

Off-ice training is essential for all Skate Canada members. Off-Ice is a requirement for STARskaters; it helps in improving flexibility and reduce the risk of injury and is just as important as on-ice training.

Incorporating fitness training into a club's STARSkate program ensures that Canadian children are getting the appropriate level of physical activity, as outlined in Health Canada's "Guide to Physical Activity for Youth". It also ensures that young figure skaters recognize that off-ice training is part of training for our sport. As the athlete develops, training will become more specific and should include the following areas:

- 1. Core Stability/Strength Training/Functional Movement
- 2. Aerobic / Anaerobic Training
- 3. Flexibility Training
- 4. Creative Movement / Dance Movement
- 5. Nutrition
- 6. Mental Training

Incorporating regular off-ice training into an athlete's annual training plan will help ensure that our members are doing all that they can to achieve their own level of personal excellence – in whatever Skate Canada program they are enrolled.

- Participants will learn exercises that are sport specific and others that will help general fitness, strength and balance.
- Participants will learn exercises that can be done both at home and in the gym.

Please note that this year the club has added enrichment to our office programming! Skaters will now be offered special off-ice days with guest instructors or presenters to come help our skaters grow on a broader basis while also enhancing our current skating program.

Our first seminar will be Nutrition, and the dates are set for Wednesday September 27th (Juniors) and Thursday September 28th (Seniors) during the normal off-ice time, 5:45-6:45 pm in the Spartan Room. We HIGHLY encourage parents to plan ahead and join us for the entirety of this off ice seminar!!

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: WHY JOIN IESC?

We are a LOCAL skating club right in Chestermere! The ice time and off-ice is offered at low cost (STARSkaters are subsidized by about 50%) despite the small classes, badges/ribbons are available to skaters as they progress, participation in competitions (the club does not subsidize any competition costs, however, the skater is able to register under the club name), photo days, year-end pizza party, demo or ice show event (if during the applicable year), program assistant training, supplementary instruction for 6 off-ice classes during the year, access to certified professional coaches, skating skills, strength, endurance and flexibility training, and gain general life skills.

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: EQUIPMENT / ATTIRE

- Figure skates, properly fitted and sharpened (coach can discuss which skates are most appropriate for your skater)
- Hard blade guards (to be used only when walking in the skates)
- Soft blade guards (to be used only when blades are DRY, during storage of the skates)
- Cloth to dry blades after ice time
- Warm up jacket
- Gloves
- Comfortable pants/tights/skating dress or skirt
- Runners or sneakers for off-ice
- Yoga mat for off-ice
- Water bottle
- Snack for between ice and off-ice
- Ensure hair is tied back
- No loose jewelry
- No hoodies

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: OVERVIEW & PROGRAM FORMAT

Objective of program – To train skaters in the sport of figure skating from CanSkate to the Learn to Compete stage of development. STAR 1-5 covers the Learn to Train stage of development and will offer the skaters a solid pathway for development.

Overview of all disciplines – Skills will train skaters on edges, turns, power and field moves. Freeskate will train skaters on jump and spin technique as well as introduce them to programs. Dance will train the skaters on dance steps and technique, pattern dances, timing and carriage. Skaters will participate in all disciplines at this level of training.

Coach assessments – Skaters in this program will be assessed by the coach that is teaching them each discipline. This will allow skaters to have access to assessments when they are ready. This will be more convenient for the parents as all assessments can be done on the skater's regular session.

Assessment to standard – All assessments in the STAR 1-5 program will be assessed to a standard. This standard will also be used at the STAR 1-5 events. Skaters are encouraged to reach a Gold standard for as many skills as they can.

Session formats – To increase and maximize coach directed time on the STAR 1-5 sessions, clubs will use a variety of formats during this "golden age of learning" to facilitate strong skill development. This includes on and off ice classes, group, semi-private or private lessons or stations.

Billing Format – Our club uses a Club/Coach directed billing format, where a portion of the STARSkate fees covers coach time (60 minutes per week for JR's, 30 minutes per week for SR's). The coach will invoice for the remainder of lessons given to the skaters. It is customary to pay your coach invoices within 2 weeks. You will receive the rates from your coaches via email.

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: COMPETITION EXPECTATIONS

- 1. Parents will enter their skaters in the competition event categories specified by the coaches; please contact the coaches or the Test & Competition Chair if you have event category/registration questions.
- Entries must be submitted on time; please watch for email reminders and reach out to our club Test &
 Competition Chair if in doubt to stay abreast of deadlines and schedule information. If a deadline is
 missed, skaters may be asked to pay a higher entry fee or may not be able to participate.
- 3. Skates must be sharpened no closer than 1 week prior to a competition to ensure any sharpening errors or adjustments can be made.
- 4. Skates must be purchased no closer than 4 weeks prior to a competition to allow time for skaters to break in their skates.
- 5. Skaters must arrive, ready for their performance, one hour ahead of their scheduled event flight time.
- 6. Skaters must wear an appropriate skating dress, neutral tone tights. Hair must be neat and hair-sprayed and tasteful make-up can be worn. Black jacket or sweater and black 'mini' gloves must be worn during warm up. Team event outfits are more flexible and may go outside of standard skater attire.
- 7. Complete competition technical requirements are available on our website.

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: TESTING

Once a skater moves to the STARSkate program, progress in Free Skate, Skating Skills and Dance is evaluated through testing. Skaters are assessed and upon successful completion move through each test level. Although the experience of testing may be a little overwhelming for both parents and skaters it is designed to celebrate the achievements of our skaters.

Testing Expectations

- 1. Parents should regularly check their emails to ensure they are aware of their skaters schedule test dates. A minimum notice period of 48 hours will be provided. Coaches will work with the Competition & test Chair to arrange testing of skaters. The Competition & Test Chair will email you when your skater will be tested.
- 2. Test fees MUST be paid before a skater will be allowed to take a test. If fees are not paid, the test will have to be rescheduled. Test fees are \$12. The current STARSkate registration fee includes \$36 in test fees (3 tests). You will be notified once the \$36 has been used. Please contact us at the end of the skating season for any remaining/unused test fee credits.
- 3. Tests will not be scheduled until the coaches deem a skater is ready to be tested. Skaters may test individually or within a group. As all skaters progress at their own pace, test days may be different for skaters participating in the same group lessons.
- 4. As all skaters progress at their own pace, test days may be differ by skater and may not align with those participating in the same group lessons.
- 5. Tests will happen during a skater's regular scheduled class lesson. Parents will be charged their normal lesson fee for the test.
- 6. Jacket and gloves can be worn during warm-up, but should be removed for the assessment, if temperature provides.
- 7. **Proper attire for** The following may be used as a suggestion for Assessment day attire: STAR 1 & 2: Regular practice attire acceptable, however performance attire is encouraged STAR 3 5: Performance attire required

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: SKATER RESPONSIBILITIES

The Skater's Role:

- Be on time
- Use interest, attention, focus and concentration
- Enact your commitment to sport
- Show an effort and willingness to try
- Practice goals and skill development
- Use coach corrections to better your skills
- Use their class time wisely (no distraction to themselves or other skaters)
- Have hair tied back, proper clothes and equipment for on and off ice classes
- Use good manners and Respect team mates, parents and coaches
- Have a tolerance for others as well as yourself

The Skater's CODE OF CONDUCT:

- Represent the Ice Edge Skating Club in a respectful and professional manner
- Strive to create and maintain cooperative relationships with skaters/parents and coaching colleagues for the purpose of ensuring a positive skating environment
- No food, gum, candy or glass containers are permitted on the ice surface
- Alcohol and drugs are forbidden at all club activities; abuse of this will result in expulsion
- Pushing, tripping, horseplay, intentional interference with other skaters or profanity may result in expulsion of the offending skater
- Leave the ice during a flood and PROMPTLY at the end of each session
- All skaters and guests are expected to dress and behave in an appropriate manner that reflects good taste and a good moral attitude
- Non-Payment of Club fees will result in the withdrawal of Skating Privileges
- Inappropriate and disrespectful behavior by Skaters and/or Parents to Coaches or Club officials can result in a temporary or permanent suspension from the Ice Edge Skating Club
- There is NO bullying, victimizing, harassing (sexual or otherwise), impersonating, vandalizing or stealing from another skater; Disciplinary actions may include the suspension or expulsion
- Skaters are to display good sportsmanship and encourage all skaters' enjoyment of skating
- Skaters are responsible for keeping the dressing rooms clean and tidy, putting away their own personal items and throwing away any garbage
- Socializing on the ice between skaters is to be kept to a minimum
- Electronic devices such as MP3 players or cell phones are not permitted during on ice or off-ice sessions without coaches approval
- Trust your coach and resolve conflicts by allowing a 24-hour cool down period; bring your issue to your parent who can direct your concern to a member of the board for resolution

The Skater's ICE ETIQUETTE:

- Soloist has the right of way but all skaters need to be aware of their surroundings and respect everyone on the ice
- Coaches doing choreography also have the right of way if they are using music
- When skating away from the boards, pay attention to oncoming skaters
- Profanity or disrespect to fellow skaters or coaches will not be tolerated
- The Coach has the authority at all times and will enforce the above rules when required

STARSkate at Ice Edge Skating Club: VOLUNTEER & FUNDRAISING

The STARSkate program is expensive to run.

Program cost information:

- ice rental \$185/hr
- room rental \$28.88/hr
- coaching stroking/skills/off-ice ~ \$40-46/hr plus mileage, depending on the coach

Skater fee information:

- ice time@~\$9.6/hr
- off-ice@~\$4/hr

STARSkate (20 skaters: 10 JR + 10 SR) program example:

- for every 1 hour of ice time the club pays \$185 and the group of 10 STARSkaters pays \$96
- for every 1 hour of off-ice time the club pays \$74.88 and the group of 10 STARSkaters pays \$40.
- for the fall/winter session of 157.50 hours of total STARSkate program ice time and 105 hours of off-ice time the cost to the club overall is:
- \$29,138 for ice
- \$3032 for off-ice room
- \$11,296 for instructor fees
- \$43,466 TOTAL COST for STARSkate September to March
- HOWEVER the revenue we get from registrations is \$22,126. We are short by \$21,340. We need to find approximately \$1000 in extra funds per skater in order for our STAR program to run. The \$100 in fundraising profits from your fundraising still does not cover what we need. We then rely on the casino funds and CanSkate surplus funds, if available, to cover the remainder.

Overview OF HOW WE ARRIVED AT THE REQUIREMENTS:

Ice Edge Skating Club offers CanSkate and STARSkate programs.

CanSkate is essential to the club as this program establishes a presence in the community and provide the basic skating skills for those interested in moving to our STARSkate program.

The majority of the operating costs for both CanSkate are covered by the program fees however this is not the case for the STARSkate program.

Our STARSkate program is the highest cost program that we offer, and the funds we receive from STARSkate registrations do not come close to covering the operating costs.

In order to keep STARSkate program fees reasonable a significant amount of fundraising is required.

Volunteer / Fundraising Commitment:

Our club is a not for profit society that is run entirely by volunteers. Board members act on behalf of the club to ensure it operates smoothly, however even with a full board (10 members) we still need additional volunteers to guarantee all the club events, programs and fundraising happens successfully.

This year, the board had decided on a new set of requirements for the STARSkaters, as a thank you for the hard work during the 2016/2017 year and also due to the fact that casino funds have become available for this upcoming year.

Requirements Rubric Explained:

Volunteer Time

Volunteers are needed for a variety of roles including board membership, special events, fundraising events etc. We are in desperate need for CanSkate class help!

- Earn 600 credits = 12 hours
- Provide One (1) Post-Dated Bond Cheques of \$200 (dated March 15, 2018)

Product Fundraising

The club will offer product fundraising opportunities once or twice per year. The offerings are seasonal/holiday-based and applicable for the time that they are offered.

- Earn 250 credits = approximately \$300 in Product Sales (generates ~ \$100 profit to the club)
- Provide One (1) Post-Dated Bond Cheques of \$100 (dated March 15, 2018): \$100
- Opt Out from Product Fundraising; due September 18, 2017: \$100 per skater

Bottle Drive Participation

Bottle Drives have proven to be a great way to raise funds and the club plans to run 2 bottle drives throughout the year.

AGM Attendance

The club must hold an Annual General Meeting each year and as per the club By-Laws the AGM must have attendance that passes as quorum (10% of the club's membership) in order to run. Skater awards are typically given at this meeting.

- Participation at the Annual General Meeting (in June each year)
- Provide a Post-Dated Bond Cheque (dated June 25): \$50 per family

Silent Auction Item

The club will host events throughout the year that afford the opportunity to have a silent auction (i.e. Paint Nite). Donations of silent auction items are required and it will be at the clubs discretion as to when a donated silent auction item will be utilized/displayed.

- Provide One (1) Silent Auction Item with a Minimum Value of \$50
- Provide a Post-Dated Bond Cheque (dated September 30, 2017): \$50 per family

Raffle Ticket Sales

Off-Ice is held in the Spartan Room on the upper level, just up the stairs from inside the Main Door vestibule.

Our Coach Room is located beside the hallway leading to the sharpening shop. This is not our office. Because we are a non-profit society run by volunteers, we do not have a permanent office space. We do store our CanSkate props and necessary club supplies in the Coach Room. "Office hours" for our volunteers vary.

Our PA's have use of the "Referee/Coach Room" on the BLUE side on Fridays and Sundays for use to prepare for CanSkate Classes.

Our club bulletin board is located on the South wall of the Rec Centre lobby.
